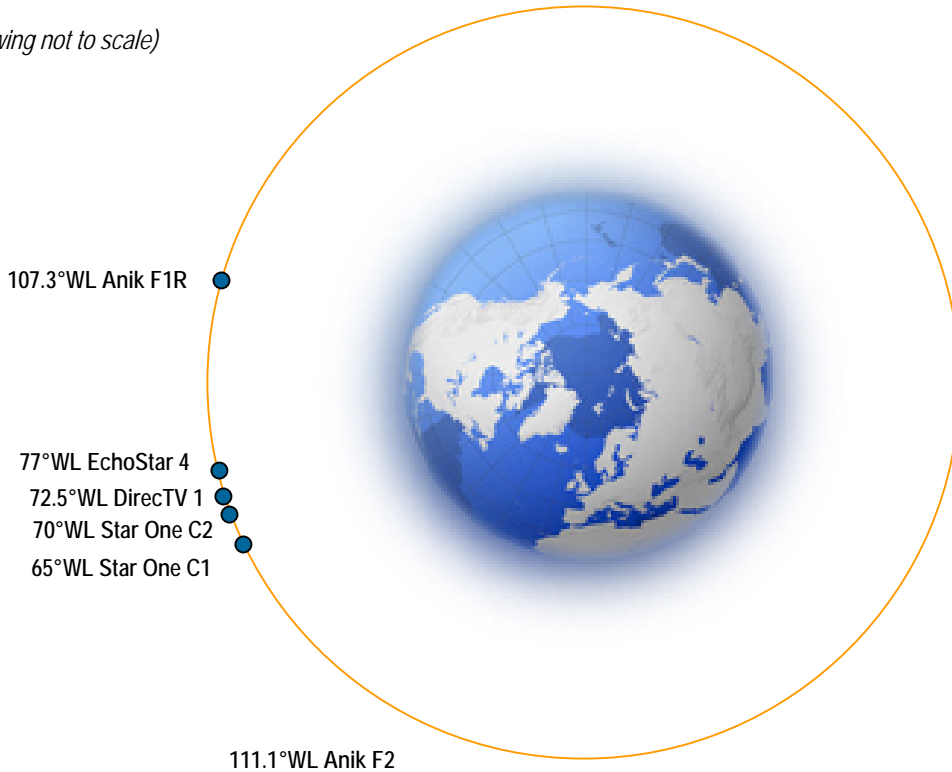


Selected Satellites with

Description of Selected Regulatory Activity for July 2005 (derived from Futron's FCCFilings.com service)		
Location	Satellite	Activity
65 WL	Star One C1	Star One reapplied to add the Star One C1 satellite to the FCC's Permitted Space Station List at 65 WL. The satellite was added to the List in late 2004, but Star One surrendered the authorization because of difficulties in securing the bond payment.
70 WL	Star One C2	Star One reapplied to add the Star One C2 satellite to the FCC's Permitted Space Station List. Its initial application was dismissed by the FCC in 2004 for failing to include required information.
72.5 WL	DirecTV 1	The FCC approved DirecTV's request to begin drifting the DirecTV 1 satellite from 101.125 WL to 72.5 WL. DirecTV 1 will replace DirecTV 5 at the Canadian orbital position.
77 WL	EchoStar 4	The FCC granted EchoStar's request for special temporary authority to stop the EchoStar 4 satellite at 77 WL and operate it there pursuant to U.S. authority for up to 30 days.
107.3 WL	Anik F1R	The FCC granted Telesat Canada's request to add the Anik F1R satellite to the FCC's Permitted Space Station List at 107.3 WL.
NGSO	SkyBridge	The FCC approved SkyBridge's request to launch and operate an 80-satellite Ku-band NGSO FSS system. The first two satellites must be launched by July 2009.
